## THE PROCESS - YOUR DONOR DOLLARS AT WORK

**01 RAISING FUNDS**  
United Way of Central Oklahoma (UWCO) raises funds.

**02 REVIEW OF AGENCIES**  
Community Investment (CI) donor volunteers review agency applications, budgets, audits, performance histories and program outcomes. They visit Partner Agencies to see firsthand the use of UWCO funds.

**03 DECISION PROCESS**  
CI volunteers discuss funding proposals for each program. The CI Committee operates within the UWCO's Board of Directors to review and balance funding proposals from the volunteers and submits a final proposal to the Board for approval.

**04 DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS RAISED**  
Following approval, the funds are distributed among UWCO's Partner Agencies.
